Captain Davis, a native of North Olmsted, Ohio, received his commission in the Coast Guard in 1987 when he graduated from the U. S. Coast Guard Academy with a Bachelor of Science degree in Marine Engineering. He reported to USCGC GALLATIN from Atlantic Area in Portsmouth, VA where as Chief of the Major Cutter Forces Section he served as the program manager for matters relating to the readiness, maintenance, training, administration, and scheduling of 30 Atlantic Area major cutters.

Captain Davis' afloat assignments include First Lieutenant aboard USCGC CITRUS (WMEC 300) in Coos Bay, Oregon; Commanding Officer of USCGC POINT EVANS (WPB 82354) in Alamitos Bay, California; Commanding Officer of USCGC MATINICUS (WPB 1315) in Cape May, New Jersey; Executive Officer of USCGC NORTHLAND (WMEC 904) in Portsmouth, Virginia; and most recently as Commanding Officer of USCGC MOHAWK (WMEC 913) in Key West, Florida.

Captain Davis' ashore assignments include Controller in the Eleventh District Command Center, Chief of Enforcement, Atlantic Area and Fifth Coast Guard District, Chief of Fisheries and Protected Species Enforcement at Coast Guard Headquarters, and Chief of the Major Cutter Forces Section at Atlantic Area.

Captain Davis holds a Master of Marine Affairs degree from the University of Rhode Island. Captain Davis' personal awards include two Meritorious Service Medals, five Coast Guard Commendation Medals, the Coast Guard Achievement Medal, the Commandant's Letter of Commendation, and numerous unit and service awards.
